The 4th World Risk and Insurance Economics Congress will take place in New York City from August 2-6, 2020. The conference will be organized by the American Risk and Insurance Association and co-organized by the European Group of Risk and Insurance Economists, the Asia Pacific Risk Insurance Association, and The Geneva Association.

Academics, PhD students, and other researchers are encouraged to submit a proposal to present their research. Papers on any risk or insurance related topics are welcome. Specific subject areas include, but are not limited to, insurance economics, risk management, behavioral risk perception, law and regulation of insurance and risk transfer mechanisms, insurance accounting, insurance company operations, corporate governance, health care, retirement, or employee benefits.

Please use “Key Words” and the JEL's classification codes (placed just below the abstract) to describe your research.

Executive summaries (not exceeding three pages) that focus on the purpose, expected results, and importance of the research may be submitted. Completed papers are preferred. Proposals from doctoral students are encouraged.

The **deadline** for submission is **February 1, 2020**. The deadline will not be extended.
